## Queries:

### **William Severs and wife Catherine Peck**

William Severs 1752 and wife Catherine Peck born ca 1770 were married in Montgomery Co VA in 1793 and were in Anderson Co when it was formed. Apparently, they were in Knox Co and in the part of Knox Co that was taken to form Anderson County. He and Phillip Seber /Seiber were in the early minutes doing work for the county on roads. and public works. Their names were butchered so badly they could only be told apart by the first names which did not vary but the last names were spelled poorly and interchanged a lot. A relationship between them has been speculated but a Y DNA test suggests they were NOT but I would like to see another test on a descendant of Phillip Seber. There have been multiple tests on the descendants of William which have matched well and match with descendants of Clark B Seivers/Severs 1830 as well as James M Severs 1788. There is a good family legend suggesting the parentage of Clark B Seivers was Jacob Peck Severs 1809 who left Anderson County just in time to be in the 1830 Census of Jefferson County Kentucky under a dark cloud of Family Disagreement suggesting he may have been the culprit.
